

ACCOUNTING: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

2019–2020 y. Autumn semester

REFERENCE PERIOD:

February 2020

AIM:

To study the *Accounting* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at Accounting study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 12 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree*. Seventy-three completed questionnaires were received.

Accounting study programme students have a positive perception of the study subjects and the quality of their teaching in the autumn semester of 2019-2020, as shown by 84% of the students who participated in the survey agreeing with the evaluation criteria.
