

# ACCOUNTING: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

2020–2021 y. Autumn semester

**REFERENCE PERIOD:**

February 2021

**AIM:**

To study the *Accounting* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

**QUESTIONNAIRE:**

Students studying at Accounting study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 14 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree*. Eighty-three completed questionnaires were received.

*Accounting* study programme students have a positive perception of the study subjects and the quality of their teaching in the autumn semester of 2020-2021, as shown by 81% of the students who participated in the survey agreeing with the evaluation criteria.
