

LOGISTICS: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

2018–2019 y. Spring semester

REFERENCE PERIOD:

From April 2019 to June 2019

AIM:

To study the *Logistics* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at Logistics study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 13 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree*. Forty-four completed questionnaires were received.

Logistics study programme students have a positive perception of the study modules and the quality of their teaching in the spring semester of 2018-2019, as shown by 65% of the students who participated in the survey agreeing with the evaluation criteria.
