TOURISM AND HOTEL MANAGEMENT: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

REFERENCE PERIOD:

From April 2022 to June 2022

AIM:

To study the *Tourism and Hotel Management* students' opinion on study modules and the quality of their teaching.

QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at Tourism and Hotel Management study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 14 criteria. Rating scale: Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree. Twenty completed questionares were received.
