RESULTS OF THE SURVEY OF THE SECOND- AND THIRD-YEAR STUDENTS OF THE FACULTY OF TECHNOLOGIES



2021-2022

The aim of the survey: to reveal the students' attitude towards the existing study conditions and assess their general satisfaction with the studies.

The survey was conducted online from March 22 to April 20, 2022, using the LimeSurvey survey system. The questionnaire was sent to 236 second- and third-year students (excluding the final year students) of the Faculty of Technologies. The obtained data was processed using SPSS 20 for Windows software.

The total return rate of the questionnaires is 50 (21.2 %). Research error 12.3 %.

SURVEY RESULTS (N=50)

The total number of 50 senior students participated in the survey, of which 40 (80 %) were second-year students. 86 % of the respondents are full-time students, and 14 % are part-time students. The majority (92 %) of the surveyed students study in state-funded study places. Almost a half (44 %) of the survey participants have jobs.

During the survey, it was revealed that 64 percent of the students of the faculty are satisfied or completely satisfied with their studies at Kaunas University of Applied Sciences (compared to 61.5 % in 2021). According to students, the most important factors influencing study satisfaction are: quality studies, appropriate study load, attractive study and learning environments and access to support. Opportunity to attend sports and students' leisure and employment conditions have the least impact on study satisfaction.

50 % of the students who participated in the survey indicated that the study load is appropriate for them (in 2021 - 42.2 %), while 32 % found their study load too high. Students appreciate the opportunities to participate in international exchange programs and academic integrity the most, but they are not sufficiently involved in applied research; the procedure for submitting and examining appeals and complaints is not clear enough.

Most students rate study and learning environments, with the exception of dormitories, as very good or good. It should be noted that more than half of the students who participated in the survey indicated that they do not use the services of the sports and health complex or the organization of student employment (do not participate in the activities of art groups, events, etc.). However, these activities are the least associated with satisfaction with studies.

98% of senior students state that the information about their studies is sufficient or partially sufficient (in 2021-95.2%). Students said that the information is available, but there is a lack of directions on where to look for it.

In order to improve the study and leisure conditions at Kaunas University of Applied Sciences, some students suggest the following: assign students more creative-project tasks; attract younger teachers to the college; pay attention to the placement of assignments during the semester; to review study plans and/or content of study subjects in some study programs.

Almost two thirds of students (62 %) would recommend the study program to their friends.
