

# OFFICE ADMINISTRATION: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

2022–2023 y. Autumn semester

## REFERENCE PERIOD:

October 2022 and January 2023

## AIM:

To study the *Office Administration* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

## QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at *Office Administration* study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 14 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree*. Thirty completed questionnaires were received.

*Office Administration* study programme students have a positive perception of the study modules and the quality of their teaching in the autumn semester of 2022-2023, as shown by 86 % of the students who participated in the survey agreeing with the evaluation criteria.
