

# LAW: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

2022–2023 y. Autumn semester

## REFERENCE PERIOD:

January 2023

## AIM:

To study the *Law students'* the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

## QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at *Law* study programme evaluated the quality of study subjects according to 14 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree*. Thirty-two completed questionnaires were received.
