## **REFERENCE PERIOD:**

From October 2023 to January 2024

#### AIM:

To study the *Applied Communication* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

### **QUESTIONNAIRE:**

Students studying at Applied Communication study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 14 criteria. Rating scale: Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree. Twenty completed questionnaires were received.
