

# FINANCE: STUDENTS SURVEY RESULTS

2023–2024 y. Spring semester

## REFERENCE PERIOD:

From April 2024 to June 2024

## AIM:

To study the *Finance* students' the opinion on study modules their quality, and teaching.

## QUESTIONNAIRE:

Students studying at *Finance* study programme evaluated the quality of study modules according to 14 criteria. Rating scale: *Strongly Agree; Agree; Neither Agree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree.*

*Finance* study programme students have a positive perception of the study modules and the quality of their teaching in the spring semester of 2023-2024, as shown by 69 % of the students who participated in the survey agreeing with the evaluation criteria.
