# **REFERENCE PERIOD:**

From September 2024 to February 2025

#### AIM:

To analyze *Logistics* students' opinions on study modules and the Quality of their teaching.

## **QUESTIONNAIRE:**

Students studying in the *Logistics* study programme evaluated the quality of study modules based on 14 criteria. The evaluation scale included the following options: *Strongly Agree; Agree; NeitherAgree nor Disagree; Disagree; Strongly Disagree.*

*Logistics* study programme students positively evaluated the study modules and the quality of teaching during the autumn semester of 2024-2025.
